The month of September has been all about introducing myself to all of the classes. In K-1, we also learned how to be a better listener by using our whole body—eyes, ears, hands, brain—to listen. In 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, we learned about self-control and how to use a "remote" to control our brain. 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> grade learned how to respond to teasing and put-downs. For example, they learned to ignore, agree with the person, change the subject, laugh, or stay away. In 5<sup>th</sup> grade, we did an experiment about respect and kindness. Ask your child what they learned in our lesson this month!

#### Library Info

Parents, would you like to receive a text message the day before your child's library day? It's easy! Just sign up for library reminders on REMIND. Since classes don't visit the library on the same day of the week each week, it can be difficult to know when to return library books. Here's how to get reminders:

- Check the chart to see which color day your child goes to library (5th grade parentsask your child which squad they are on for specials)
- 2. Text 81010
- 3. Type your child's library color day code (on chart) as the message
- That's it! You should receive a text the day before your child's next library day. If you don't, or need help, please contact Mrs. Bresnehen.

Find your child's teacher and use the code for that color. Then text 81010 with that code in the message.
